



TIPS FOR ADULT LEARNERS BEFORE YOU SELECT A SCHOOL

- Don't limit your options to schools your friends attended, but do talk to your work colleagues!
- Don't be limited to schools near your home; all EPCE programs are online, and many other institutions offer online programs.
- Know all your financial options; your company may have Tuition Assistance or Tuition Reimbursement which can help pay tuition and other fees.
- Find out if the school you are interested in welcomes working adults; colleges should offer a flexible schedule/asynchronous courses that let you study when it is convenient for you.
- Find a school that values what you've learned in the workplace; many colleges have Credit for Prior Learning, also called Prior Learning Assessment, programs that will allow you to earn college credit for credentials and experiences you've had outside of the classroom, including military experience.
- Find out the details of the program e.g. How many courses are required? How many weeks is each course? How many hours a week do they anticipate you'll spend studying?

TIPS FOR ADULT LEARNERS ONCE YOU ARE ENROLLED

- Advocate for yourself in the online classroom by asking questions via email or in discussion boards, especially if you have questions about class topics.
- Remember, it is difficult for faculty members to know if you need help if you don't ask (because they can't see your face or body language in an online course).
- Use the Discussion Boards to bond and learn from other students in your online classes.
- Most of the students in your class will be working adults, like you, and you can share the joys and pains of learning together through this period of your life.
- Ask your online instructor or advisor for help when you need it.
- A lot of us in the workplace haven't been writing papers in many years. Ask your advisor or faculty member if you need assistance. Many schools have writing coaches or workshops that can assist you (online).
- Set aside time to study.
- Make the commitment to study X hours a day. Maybe it is just one hour a day! Starting small is fine.
